Affordable Housing Dashboard: A Resource for Affordable Housing Information

Commissioner Feng inquired about a Commissioner request from the July 17, 2021 FCRHA retreat regarding privately-owned housing units developed with FCRHA financing. Vincent Rogers, Director, Policy and Compliance for the Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD), responded that the Commissioner was directed to the Affordable Housing Dashboard, maintained by HCD, as a starting point regarding this request.

Chair McKenna named Commissioner Maribojoc as the FCRHA's Housing Symposium Liaison. Since the annual symposium is a joint event between the FCRHA and the George Mason University School of Business, Chair McKenna stated that Commissioner Maribojoc's association with George Mason makes it ideal in terms of the partnership. Chair McKenna informed the Commissioners that Commissioner Maribojoc continues to work with HCD staff in putting together the agenda for the event and taking care of the administrative and logistical matters relating to the symposium, which will take place on Thursday, March 17, 2022, at George Mason University. Commissioner Maribojoc expressed his thanks for this designation and stated that it is a pleasure working with Vincent Rogers and Linda Hoffman, Management Analyst for HCD, and expressed hope for an in-person symposium in 2022.
